1 Introduction

The `odbc` access method is a module which implements the `recio` [1] provider interface allowing the `recio` [1] user interface to support reading data from an ODBC data source. This access method extends the scope of accessing data via `recio` [1] to any data source that can be defined by an ODBC data source name and should be used in conjunction with the `odbcddl` access method [2] which generates meta data describing the result set that is returned.

2 Open String Specification

As with all `recio` [1] library open specification strings, three components comprise the open string: access method, object, and options name-value pairs.

2.1 Open Specification Access Method Name

The access method name should be specified as `odbc`.

2.2 Open Specification Object Name

The object name is an SQL query statement that resolves to a result set. This is usually a select statement.

2.3 Open Specification Option Name-Value Pairs

Consult the access method definition file for the option name-value pairs supported by the `text` access method. The access method definition file also supplies details of the default values (if any) of the options.

2.4 Open String Specification Examples

2.4.1 Introduction

The following examples and ODBC configuration files were run against and adhere to these versions of the respective databases:

- MySQL.

```
hayward@giraffe:odbcam>mysql -V
mysql Ver 14.14 Distrib 5.1.42, for suse-linux-gnu (i686) using readline 6.0
```

- UDB DB2.

```

2.4.2 MySQL example

The following open string specification could be used to read the list of tables defined in a MySQL database using the data source name of MySQL

```
"odbc([select table_schema,table_name from information_schema.tables],
      source=MySQL,user=myuser,password=somepassword) "
```

as in the following cmlcopy (where the user and password are defaulted to the logged on user):

2.4.3 UDB DB2 example

Similarly the following open string specification will read the list of tables defined in a UDB DB2 database

```
"odbc([select creator,name from sysibm.systables],source=SAMPLE)"
```

as in the following cmlcopy:

2.4.4 Oracle example

And Lastly the following open string specification will read the list of tables defined in an Oracle database

```
"odbc([select owner,table_name from all_all_tables],
      source=OracleODBC10g,user=system,password=sys) "
```

as in the following cmlcopy:

3 odbc access method definition file

The access method definition file should be consulted for the description of the options and their default values. This includes the description of the options. The access method definition file should also be consulted for the processing modes supported by the access method.

Refer to the `recio` library documentation for interpreting the contents of the access method definition file.

    "DSN to be bypassed. Consult the documentation of the driver being "
    "used for information on the parameters and values that may be set."

describe user as
    "user is the the user ID with which to connect to the ODBC data source."

describe password as
    "password is the the authentication string for specified user. "
    "If it has special characters then enclose it in [...]."
    ;

describe null_indicator as
    "null_indicator refers to the value the NULL indicator is set to when a "
    "column in a result set is NULL.";

describe nulls as
    "nulls refers to a single byte indicator for each DB2 NULLABLE "
    "column that is embedded in the result row either before or after "
    "the data for that column.";

describe init_image as
    "init_image refers to the value the bytes of each new row are "
    "initialised to before being fetched. This mostly affects VARCHAR "
    "type columns where trailing bytes of the column will be set to this "
    "value";

describe meta_data as
    "meta_data is set to the value NO, which causes the access method to "
    "only return the result set associated with the SQL query given."
    ;

constrain source as "^\\(\\([a-zA-Z0-9_\\+\\)\\|\\([dD][cC]:.*\\)\\)\\)$";
constrain user as "^[a-zA-Z0-9_\\+\\)\\|\\([dD][cC]:.*\\)\\)\\)$";
constrain password as ".*";
constrain null_indicator as "[A-Za-z!$%&*+##?]\\)$";
constrain nulls as "\\(before\\|after\\)\\)$";
constrain init_image as "^\\.\\|0[xX][0-9a-fA-F][0-9a-fA-F]\\)\\)$";
constrain meta_data as "\\([Nn][Oo]\\)\\)$";

path = ${CODEMAGUS_AMDLIBS} "%s";
module = "odbcam" ${CODEMAGUS_AMDSUFDL};
entry = odbcam_init;
```

4 Environment

The location and format of the access method definition file is required to be specified by the environment variable `CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH`. This environment variable supplies a pattern to the full path of where access method definition (or `amd`) files are located. The format of the environment variable is that of a path with a `%s` appearing in the position in which the access method member name should appear. For example, on MVS systems this might have the form:

```
CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH='DNCT00.SRDA1.AMDFILES(%s)'
```

On a Unix-based system, the value might be set in a shell profile file such as:

```
export CODEMAGUS_AMDPATH=$HOME/bin/%s.amd
```

On Windows systems, the value might be supplied from the environment variables and look something like:

```
C:\CodeMagus\bin\%s.amd
```
